Publication process

Our editorial team will take you through every step of improving your paper and helping it reach its full potential for publication. The deadline for submission for this quarterly issue is on **the 30th of July 2022**.

Attach a short bio and an abstract along with your paper and send it to our email account: submissions@thehagueinternational.blog, addressing it to the Editor in Chief, Deivid Mustafa.

Once you submit your paper, it will go under a selection process, the results of which will be announced within one week after the deadline for submission. The result of the quarterly issue will comprise a curated version of the best submissions. Therefore, we reserve the right of the selection and whilst we cannot guarantee that every submission will be published, every author will be given consideration.

The editorial process is expected to last two months, followed by the official publication at the beginning of September 2022. We kindly request you to adjust your schedule accordingly as unfinalised submissions will not be considered for publication.

Submission Guidelines

In case the authors are submitting the work for the first time, they must declare the originality and ownership of the contribution and warrant that their work is not being considered for publication elsewhere (download this document and send us a scan of the signed version along with your submission). In case the rights of the work are not owned by the author(s), relevant permission for the reproduction should be submitted along with the work. Please notify the editorial team upon such a situation.

We welcome co-written pieces, however, we do not encourage voluminous and overly legalistic submissions for the digital publication, hence we recommend shorter pieces evolving around daily issues.

We accept:

- Short pieces: 1000 - 3500 words;
- Articles: 5000 - 7000 words;
- Opinion pieces: 800 - 2500 words;
- Case summaries or commentaries: 1500 - 4000 words;
- Excerpts from books: 1500 - 4000 words;
- Book reviews: 1500 - 3000 words;
- Notes on new interesting legislation: 1000 - 3000 words.

The aforelisted word counts do not include the footnotes!

Format

We kindly request you have your submissions in the Word format:

- Written in plain English.
- Font: Times New Roman, size 12, 1.5 spaced and 2.5 cm margins.
- Citations: OSCOLA citation system (4th edition) font Times New Roman, size 10.
